#### **PBIS**

What is PBIS?

PBIS stands for Positive Behavior Interventions and Supports. It's a way for schools to create a positive and effective learning environment for students. The main idea behind PBIS is to teach kids the behaviors that are expected of them, just like they learn subjects like math or science. Here at Smith School, we:

- Teach Positive Behavior: PBIS focuses on teaching kids what behaviors are expected in different situations. This includes things like being respectful, responsible, and safe (our school wide expectations).
- 2. Reinforcing Positive Behavior: When students show the expected behaviors, they receive positive reinforcement. This can be praise, rewards, or other positive responses (most popular is the bee sticker). The idea is to encourage good behavior by recognizing and rewarding it.
- 3. Have Consistent Expectations: PBIS helps to establish clear and consistent expectations for behavior across the school. This way, students know what is expected of them in every part of the school, from the classroom to the cafeteria to the playground (see our matrix below).
- 4. Support Early Intervention: If a student is struggling with behavior, PBIS provides early intervention strategies. Instead of just punishing students for misbehavior, PBIS looks at why the behavior is happening and provides support to help the student make better choices.
- 5. Create a Positive School Climate: Ultimately, PBIS aims to create a positive and supportive school climate where both students and teachers can thrive. It's not just about managing behavior; it's about creating an environment where everyone feels safe, respected, and ready to learn.



## **5-Point Scale**

Students have been learning about controlling and understanding their emotions. School wide we use a 5-point scale to communicate how we are feeling. Students are working hard to self-regulate and understand what to do when they are at a 3, 4, or 5.

#### 4th Grade

4th grade math students in Mrs. Hay's room have been working hard at solving multi-step word problems using addition, subtraction, and multiplication. We have taken a deep dive to identify key words and phrases that help us decide what operation is needed to solve the problem. We are now moving into division!! There are lots of fun games to play with just a deck of cards, or logging into your students' IXL account. Keep practicing those multiplication basic facts!!!

## Second grade news:

In Social Studies, second graders have been learning about mapping. This included learning the name of their town, state, country, and continent. They are learning cardinal direction, and created their very own compass rose.

In Science, they finished a unit on properties of materials. They had the opportunity to work in a small group to plan and assemble a monster using various materials. The monster had to fit certain criteria. Here they are hard at work!







#### First Grade:

In Social Studies, this month we have learned about veterans and the branches of the military. Also, students loved learning about United States symbols such as the flag and the bald eagle. We have discussed how to be a good citizen at school and within our community. Students had great ideas to share! We are currently learning about gratitude.

In Math, First Graders continue to learn lots about solving addition and subtraction equations! They are currently learning a variety of strategies for solving subtraction equations specifically, such as: counting on, making 10 to subtract, learning fact families, and using addition to subtract. In our next unit, we will continue to work with equations. They will learn to prove if equations are true or false, find unknown numbers in equations, and solve word problems with three addends! You can help with our learning by continuing to practice counting and solving simple word problems at home!

In Reading, First Graders are learning to retell fiction stories. They are listening to books like <a href="Chrysanthemum">Chrysanthemum</a> by Kevin Henkes and <a href="Fritz">Fritz</a> and the Beautiful Horses</a> by Jan Brett to practice retelling the beginning, middle, and end with a partner. Students have a daily reading time where they practice choosing "Just Right" books and reading those books for enjoyment; this is called Individualized Daily Reading (IDR). In Writing, First Graders are working on How To informational books. They have learned to start by thinking of an idea, making a list of things you need, and then writing the steps. Students have learned to add arrows and labels to their pictures to make the steps clear for the reader.

## Kindergarten

KIndergarteners have been working on animal habitats. So far we have learned about frogs and salmon. We will also be working on owls and wolves soon. In math we've been focusing on numbers 0-10 and are getting ready to start addition. In literacy we are working on beginning sounds, rhyming and high frequency words. In writing we are focusing on things we are thankful for!

#### **Harvest of the Month (October)**

Mrs. Layman read Applesauce Day to classes during lunch. The Harvest of the Month featured menu item for October was Apples. We served applesauce and gave out apple stickers.



## **Mentoring Program at Smith School**

Smith School has been very fortunate to be able to offer a school-based Mentor Program since 2008. The program was just awarded a grant through the Saxifrage Fund and the Maine Community Foundation to ensure that this program will be available to more students for this school year. Mentoring students look forward to the visits with their mentors each week. Some of the activities the mentors and students may participate in include crafts, building models, playing games, reading, and eating lunch together. The program requires the mentor to spend approximately one-half hour to an hour with your assigned students each week during school hours. 
