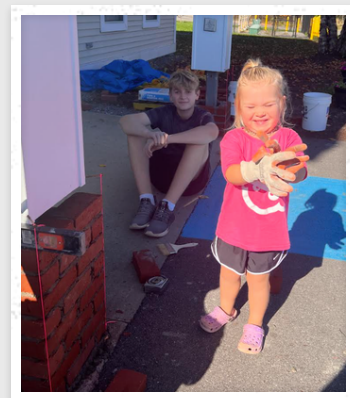
Welcome November! The change in weather is letting us know November is here!

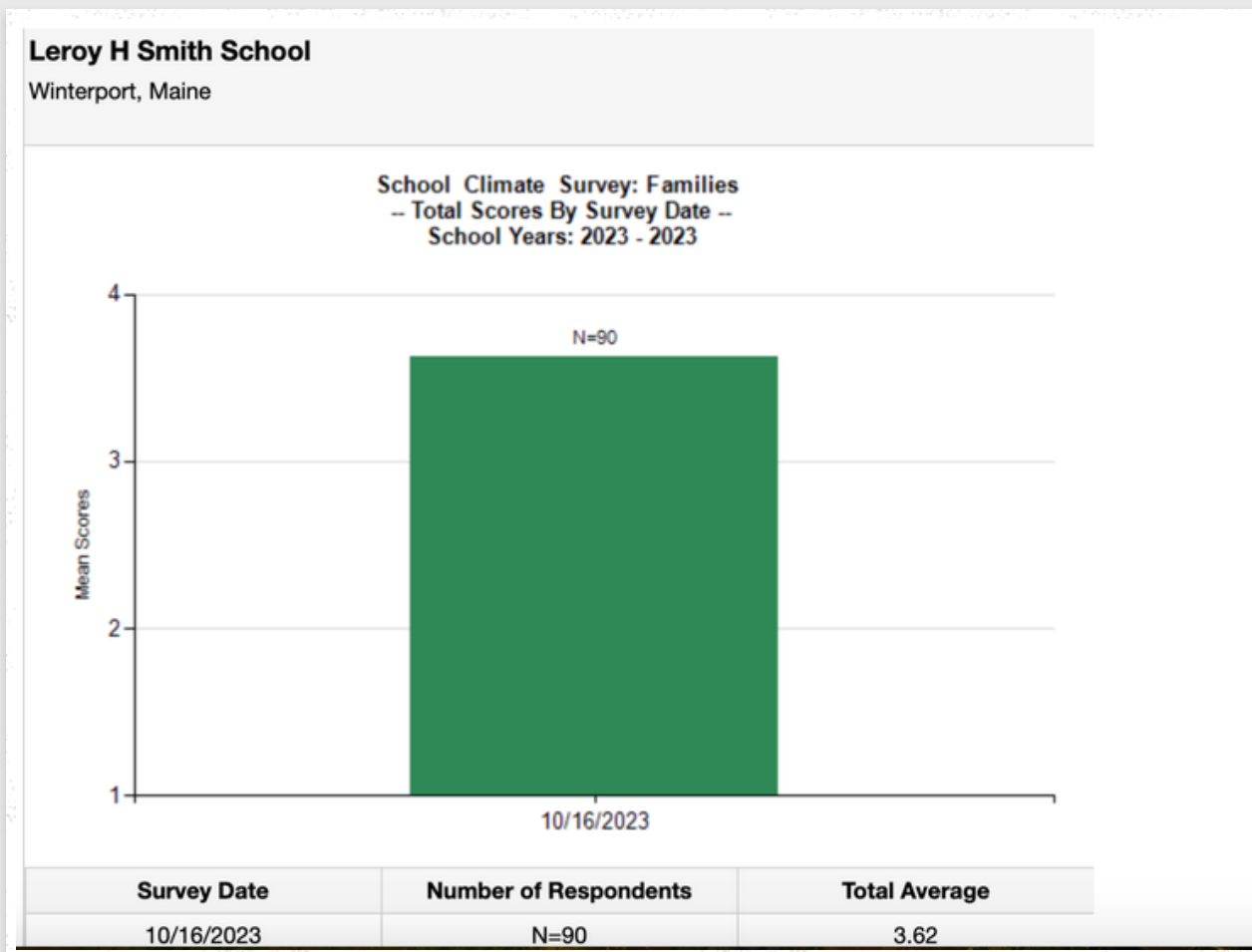

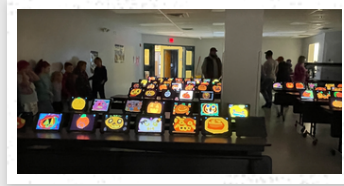

## TECHNOLOGY

In technology class, we focus on encouraging students to see themselves as **good digital citizens**/users. Students start by learning how to use a core set of tools. The iPad is a special type of tool: we can program the iPad to function as many different kinds of tools simply by downloading different apps. Grades K-3 learn to use the Draw and Tell and Pages app to draw and practice with the touch screen technique, GarageBand to make music, and ScratchJr. to program/code interactive stories. K-3 students shared their digital pumpkins by creating a DIGITAL PUMPKIN PATCH for the last all school meeting and it proved to be fantastic:) Good job Smith School Bees!

Grade 4 students have transitioned from iPads to Chromebooks this year, which is a very different tool. Chromebooks are internet machines, so we start with internet safety lessons! We have done some coding with the <http://code.org> site and will be continuing to learn more

with that. While continuing to practice good digital citizenship, students are learning all things Google, through Google Classroom we are working with Google Docs/Slides/Sheets/Draw.



## PE

For the past few weeks in PE class we have been working on our catching and throwing skills. I always find this unit to be one of my favorites because of the games and activities we are able to play while we practice. Obviously, at each grade level we are looking for different amounts of skill level and understanding of the skills we are practicing. I look forward to wrapping up our first Trimester, and heading into the winter months.

### Responsibility Overview

This month we are talking about Responsibility. One way to define Responsibility is "taking action and understanding the impact of our choices." Taking action can mean doing the right thing or completing the tasks you have been assigned. Understanding the impact of our choices means that our actions matter. Positive and responsible actions can help people and irresponsible actions can hurt others.

Responsibility is 1 of 3 traits we will focus on throughout the year that helps students **Be Strong**.

Across grade levels students will be developing skills like focusing, organizing, and goal-setting.

### PurposeFull Pursuits

Have some fun connecting as a family this month while practicing Responsibility. Here are 2 "PurposeFull Pursuits" you can complete together!

**#1** As a family, think of ways in which you might make someone's life a little easier by helping a neighbor or family friend with 1 of their Responsibilities. Could you bring the garbage to the chute or out to the curb? Could you carry things in from the grocery store? Could you invite someone over for a meal or a show?

**#2** Review Responsibility as a family! Responsibility is taking action and understanding the impact of our choices. Choose 1 household chore (or more!) that requires multiple steps. Then have each member of the family select 1 step to complete to help get the job done! Maybe it's washing the dishes, doing laundry, cleaning the living room, or unloading the groceries – whatever it is, see who can be the quickest or most effective at their task!

### Conversation Starters

- Can you share or show what it means to be Responsible?
- How can we help each other practice being more Responsible?
