KINDERGARTEN

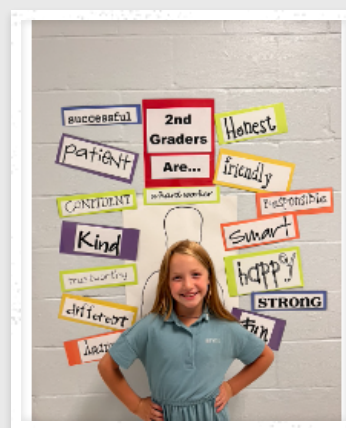
Kindergarteners have had a great start to the school year! We have been working on routines and procedures while getting to know the school and our friends.

LIBRARY

Dear Parents,

Reading is one of the most important skills your child will learn in school. Like all skills, improvement comes with practice, and your school library provides a wide variety of books for students to borrow for reading pleasure, information, and practice. Your child's class will be visited by me every other week to select a book. You can help your child by reading to, or with, her/him and asking questions about the story. Encourage your child to spend time reading at home every day.

- Students are responsible for their library book(s). They are taught to handle their books with care, since they are for everyone to share. Please keep books away from pets, food and all liquids.
- Any item that is damaged should be reported to the librarian, Mrs. McCrillis, as soon as possible so repairs, if possible, can be made.
- Library items may be kept for three weeks, then must be returned. A book can be renewed (checked out again) if your child is not done reading it. An overdue, or late, book means the student cannot borrow another book. Please help your child bring their library book back on time.
- If an item is lost, payment toward a replacement, or another copy of the book, will be requested from you.
- If your family plans to move to a new school district, please return all library items before moving.

We hope your child will read and enjoy many books and grow in reading skills during his/her school year.
